Principal's Report

Term 4 Guidelines & Planning

We are eagerly awaiting the next set of guidelines from the DoE, in response to COVID-19, which will inform our forward planning for next term. This information will determine how we structure and plan for end of year events such as Presentation Day and Year 6 Graduation activities. Hopefully, these events can go ahead in some fashion close to normal, along with additional opportunities for school incursions/excursions in the final term of 2020. When the path ahead is clearer and confirmed, we will communicate plans to families.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Our PBL program has continued to develop this term at Temora West. Students who are consistently showing our school values of respect, responsibility, honesty and empathy are being rewarded each week. We have also had fewer negative incidents in the playground over the past week or so which is pleasing to see! Our first 'PBL Super Draw' for this year will be drawn for students today, with many fantastic prizes up for grabs. Those students who have earned a 'PBL Special Mention' this term will have an automatic pick for one of the prizes, a fitting reward for their extra effort in displaying our school values.

NRL Clinics

We were lucky to have a visit from NRL development officers on Tuesday, with clinics being run on the back oval for all students. There will also be opportunities for students to participate in the 'League Stars' program during the school holidays and information for these sessions was shared with the children. Thanks to James from the NRL for these initiatives.

School Based Apprenticeships & Traineeships

We have partnered with the Temora High School to enable Year 11 students to work as trainee School Learning & Support Officers (SLSO's) for one day a week at our school from next term. This is a valuable opportunity for both schools and in particular, the Year 11 students, who will gain confidence and skills to assist them with their transition from school and out into the workforce.

All the staff wish our students and families an enjoyable, relaxing and safe break from school! Don't forget that there is no pupil free day/staff development day to start Term 4, so it will be back to normal classes from Monday, 12th October.
