Cross Country

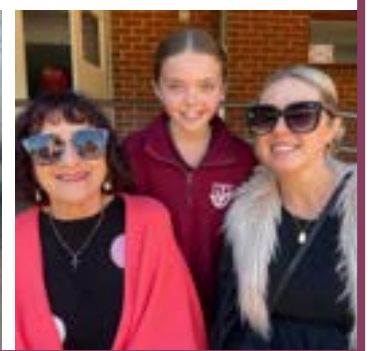
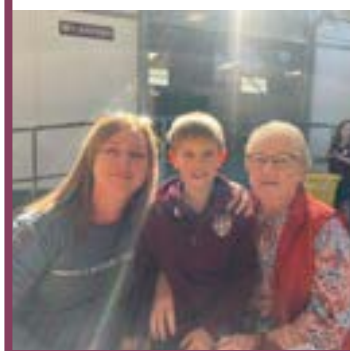
